# FROM JEFF'S DESK ...

It's unfortunate that money has become such a negative word in the minds of people of faith. Money is, after all, a profoundly spiritual issue in that what we do with our money and possessions matters deeply to God.

In the Bible, 1 Peter 4:10 reminds us, "Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received."

God's gifts are referred to as manifold — not just a few, but an abundant variety of spiritual and material gifts. Note that because they are "gifts," that doesn't mean they now belong to us. God does not transfer ownership but rather entrusts them to our care, meaning the question is not what do we want to do with these abundant gifts, but what does God want us to do with them? Clearly, what God wants is for us to practice good stewardship.

Merriam-Webster defines "stewardship" as "the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care." This is where faithful discipleship comes in. As disciples, we are accountable to God and we are responsible to care for, wisely manage and use God's gifts in support of others and all of creation. The good news is that in sharing what we've been given, we become part of something bigger than ourselves. In our giving, we participate in God's gracious love for the world and become the hands and feet of Christ to our neighbors.

In this way, stewardship and a congregation's mission are connected. People of faith want to be part of a church that is making a difference. Stewardship gives them that opportunity. As Henri Nouwen once said, "Asking people for money is giving them the opportunity to put their resources at the disposal of the kingdom." I would add that it's also an opportunity for people to grow in their faith.

May we all grow in our faith as we understand and exercise the discipline of faithful stewardship.

## SESSION NOTES

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Oyster Bay held a regular meeting on October 21, 2025.

CLERK'S REPORT: Cathy noted that Session needs to call the Annual Fall Congregational Meeting. Session called the meeting for November 16, 2025. It will be moderated by Executive Presbyter & Stated Clerk Kate Jones-Calone, as Jeff has requested a change in the nature of his pastoral connection to this church. As first considered last Fall, new rules regarding mandated medical insurance for Installed Pastors have increased the cost to both congregations and individual pastors of that medical coverage. In order to realize a significant savings for both the church and Jeff and Barbara Prey, Jeff requests changing his status from an Installed Pastor to a Covenant Pastor under Presbytery rules. In order to make this change, the congregation must vote at a Congregational Meeting to dissolve the current pastoral relationship, and the Session needs to hire Jeff back on an annual basis as a Covenant Pastor, formerly known as Temporary Supply. This means the Session calls Jeff as Pastor, rather than the congregation.

After discussion the Session approved the following motion:

"At Jeff's request, the Session approved a motion to recommend to the congregation that by vote at the Annual Congregational Meeting on November 16, 2025, it dissolve the current pastoral relationship between Pastor Jeff Prey and First Presbyterian Church of Oyster Bay of "Installed Pastor" as of December 31, 2025, with the understanding that the Session will hire Jeff back on an annual basis each January to December as a "Covenant Pastor." Nothing in the pastoral relationship or Jeff's duties will change, other than the fact that this will allow Jeff and his wife Barbara to enroll in Medicare for their medical insurance at significant savings to both the Church and to the Preys."

Jeff will circulate to the Session and then send to the congregation a letter regarding this vote so the congregation knows it will take place at the Congregational Meeting.

Jeff will check with all employees on whether they have completed their required harassment trainings. Elders who have not yet completed the first module will report to Cathy once they have completed the module. The Christian Education team will determine training requirements for Sunday School teachers.

MODERATOR'S REPORT: Jeff reported with joy that on October 12, 2025 he performed the baptism of Shea Daniel Silva, born December 23, 2024 to Paige (Koster) Silva and David Silva.

CHURCH SUPPORT: The first stewardship letters on annual pledges and church support have gone out. Mia inquired about the feasibility of using a payment system like Zelle or Venmo for church pledges or donations. The team will look into this.

PRESBYTERY REPORT: There is a Presbytery Day on November 15 with a variety of workshops and other offerings, for any Elder interested in participating.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: The committee is meeting and will present nominees for 2026 when they have completed their work.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE: The committee has begun conducting annual reviews.
